Introduction of the networking session

The definition of a clear European strategy for international cooperation in the ICT field is recognized to possess major relevance in the design of the ICT priorities.

International Cooperation issues have been under discussion within the Networked Media objective pushed by the GlobalNEM Activity created by the European Technology Platform NEM. However, recommendations made cover wide areas beyond NEM. There is a need to discuss the Int'l Cooperation strategy with other research areas: mobility, satellite communications, software and services, etc.

- Identification of ways to execute the recommendations
